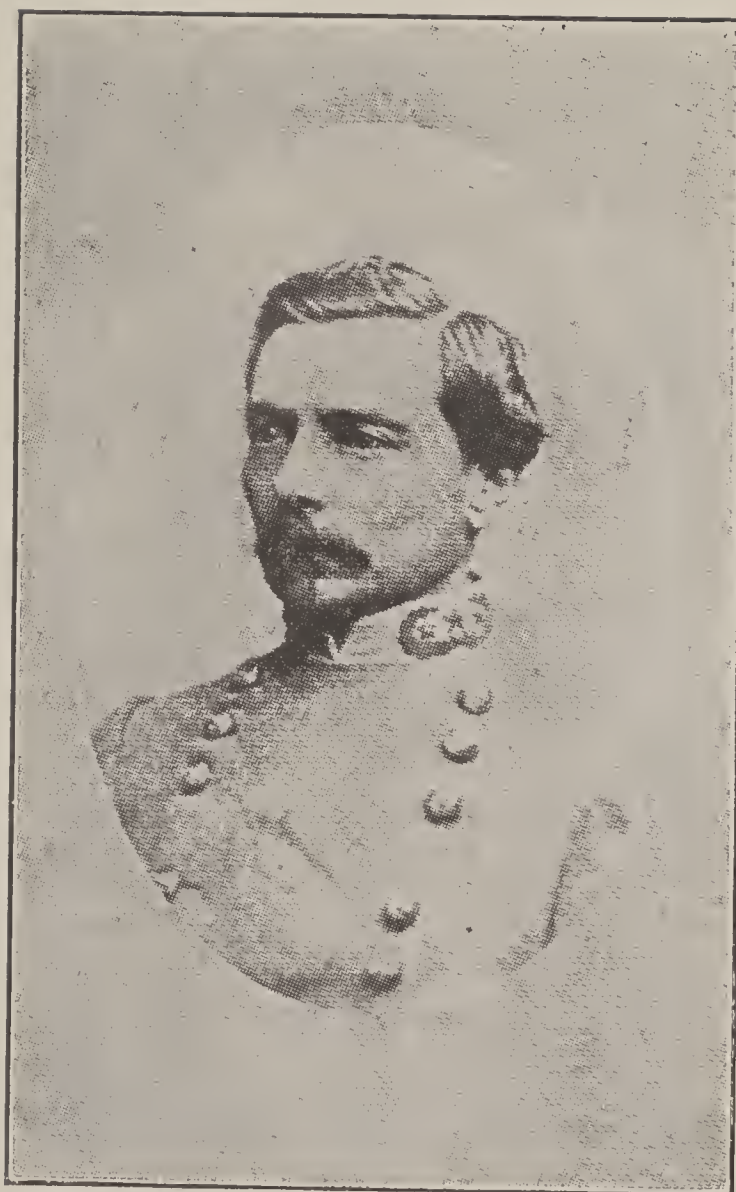

# Address of President Alden McLellan

at the unveiling of

## Statue of Gen'l G. T. Beauregard

at City Park, New Orleans

November 11th, 1915.

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Ladies, Comrades, Fellow Citizens,

In the name of the Beauregard Monument Association, I thank you again for your presence. A little less than two years ago, (on November 14th, 1913), the corner stone of this monument was laid, and to day we are proud and happy to have you witness the consumation of our labor.

In October 1907 the New Orleans City Park Association granted this ground for the Monument, and on May 28th, 1908 the Plot was dedicated with appropriate ceremonies.

The contract for a Bronze Equestrian Statue, which should embody the likeness of General G. T. Beauregard, was given to Mr. Alex. Doyle of New York, in December 1908, and how well he has succeeded in reproducing the features of our well beloved Leader, will be seen when this statue is unveiled.

The granite pedestal and surrounding pavement, was constructed by the Albert Weiblen Marble & Granite Co. of this City.

The Corner Stone of this part of the Monument was laid, with appropriate ceremonies on May 28th, 1913.

To-day we present to you to our Country, and to the World this Equestrian Statue, a monument of Granite and Bronze, to forever commemorate our illustrious fellow Citizen, eminent Engineer and Soldier—G. T. Beauregard, General Confederate States Army.

# Beauregard Monument Association

Nov. 11th, 1915.

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On the night of the day that General G. T. Beauregard died, February 21st, 1893, Henry St. Paul Camp No. 16 U. C. V. held their regular meeting at the old No. 138 Gravier St. between St. Charles and Camp Sts.

At this meeting upon resolution it was unanimously agreed that upon adjournment the camp resolve itself into a committee to consider the most appropriate manner of organizing an association for the purpose of "raising funds for the erection of a monument commemorative of the patriotic deeds and noble achievements of the great Louisiana soldier and General, Pierre Gustave Toutant Beauregard," whose mortal remains were at that time awaiting the final rites of burial. There were fifteen members present and all remained as follows: Capt. James Demoruelle, Lieut. James A. Pierce, M. T. Ducros, James Campbell, A. B. Booth, Paul Conrad, Lawson L. Davis, Jno. W. Fairfax, U. A. Gueringer, H. E. Witherspoon, and John St. Paul.

The committee organized by calling Capt. Joseph Demoruelle to preside.

At this original meeting subscriptions were invited as a beginning for a monument fund, and the following amounts were subscribed, namely: Joseph Demoruelle, \$5.00; Paul Conrad, \$50.00; M. T. Ducros, \$10.00; James A. Pierce, \$10.00; James Campbell, \$5.00; Lawson L. Davis, \$10.00; B. A. Baras, \$5.00; A. B. Booth, \$2.50; John W. Fairfax, \$25.00; U. A. Gueringer, \$10.00; A. Guibet, \$5.00; Henry Larguier, \$5.00; Jerry Lyons, \$5.00; P. A. McDonald, \$5.00; F. L. Place, \$5.00; John L. Rapier, \$25.00; H. E. Witherspoon, \$5.00; John St. Paul, \$5.00; a total of \$197.50.

Messrs. George St. Paul, J. L. Rapier, B. A. Baras, and F. L. Place; having come in late, making a total of nineteen present, all of whom subscribed.

Of those nineteen only seven are now living namely: Joseph Demoruelle, James A. Pierce, A. B. Booth, John W. Fairfax, Henry Larguier, John St. Paul and George St. Paul, This \$197.50 was the first money paid into the Monument fund.

This organization committee proceeded to organize "The Beauregard Monument Association" which was incorporated on the 23rd day of February, 1893, two days after the initial meeting.

This charter provided that the affairs of the Association should be managed, and its corporate powers exercised by an executive committee of fifty members of which seven should constitute a quorum.

The first officers of the association were:

Gen. Wm. Porcher Miles, 1st Vice-President;  
Gov. Saml. D. McEnery, 2nd Vice-President;  
Capt. Lawson L. Davis, 3rd Vice-President;  
A. B. Booth, Secretary; and John Glynn, Jr. Treasurer;

of these six officers the speaker is the only one living.

The original executive committee of fifty when completed, was:

Gov. F. T. Nicholls, Gen. J. B. Gordon, Gen. W. L. Cabell, Gov. S. D. McEnery, Gen. John Glynn, Jr., Gen. Leon Jastremski, Gen. J. B. Vinet, Gen. G. O. Watts, Judge F. P. Poche, Hon. J. Numa Augustin, C. H. Hyams, Hon. A. L. Tissot, Mayor John Fitzpatrick, Gen. W. J. Behan, Albert Baldwin, Gen. Geo. Moorman, Col. E. B. Wheelock, Capt. Chas. A. Brusle, Col. Joseph Henry, Gen. T. A. Faries, Prosper Ganel, F. T. Howard, Gen. E. Kirby Smith, Judge Albert Voorhies, John L. Rapier, Gov. Charles Parlange, Hon. T. L. Broussard, Hon. Edwd. D. White, Hon. Don. Caffery, Jules Tuyes, Gen. Jubal A. Early, B. F. Forman, Col. J. C. Denis, Hon. Walter H. Rogers, Hon. B. F. Jonas, Gen. C. A. Harris, Gen. Wm. Porcher Miles, Gov. Murphy J. Foster, Hon. Henry P. Kernaghan, Lawson L. Davis, James Campbell, Paul Conrad, M. T. Ducros, John W. Fairfax, Jeremiah Lyons, Jno. E. Nores, H. E. Witherspoon, A. B. Booth, U. A. Gueringer, and Joseph Demoruelle.

Of these one, Hon. John Fitzpatrick resigned and only eight of the others are now living and are serving on the committee, namely: W. J. Behan, Edw. D. White, Murphy J. Foster, Jno. W. Fairfax, Jno. E. Nores, Joseph Demoruelle, A. B. Booth and C. H. Hyams.

A graded membership in the Association was provided as follows; those who subscribed \$1.00 but less than \$2.00 were associate members, those who subscribed \$2.00 but less than \$10.00 were to become members, and those who subscribed \$10.00 or more become Honorary members.

Officers were elected to serve until death, but in filling vacancies only members, or Honorary members, were to be eligible to hold office in the Association.

July 9th, 1893, Fk. T. Howard, Chairman, with E. B. Wheelock and Walter H. Rogers were appointed a committee on Design, for Monument. These are all dead.

August 16th, 1893, Fk. T. Howard, E. B. Wheelock, W. H. Rogers, Charles Parlange, Leon Jastremski, Joseph Demoruelle and Albert Baldwin, were appointed a committee on location. Of these, comrade Joseph Demoruelle is the only one living.

The progress of the Association in getting in subscriptions was evidenced by the Treasurers reports, which showed cash receipts to May 16th, 1893. to be \$2,343.25.

A sham battle and entertainment was arranged by the co-operation of army of Tennessee Camp No 2 U. C. V.; cavalry association Camp No. 9 U. C. V.; Washington Artillery Camp No. 15 U. C. V.; Henry St. Paul Camp No. 16 U. C. V.; Army of Northern Va. Camp No. 1 U. C. V.; and Ex-United States Army soldiers in the city of New Orleans, on Oct. 20th, 1895, which netted, \$1,336.65.

The treasurer's report showed cash receipts up to May 5th, 1899, of \$4,408.12.

On April 19th, 1899, the Ladies Confederate Memorial Association was invited to co-operate with us in our work, which invitation was accepted, and later they contributed \$35.00, and worked with the U. D. C. in raising funds.

At a meeting held in Memorial Hall June 18th, 1899, the New Orleans Chapter No. 72 U. D. C. by resolution pledged itself to co-operation with us in our work. Their faithful work followed from year to year until they had secured and turned into our treasury various subscriptions amounting to about \$6,000.00.

August 10th, 1899, General Nicholls was elected Honorary President and Col. J. B. Richardson was elected President. Active efforts were made to secure subscriptions by appeals to the public through the newspapers and by circulars.

Nov. 23rd and 24th, an entertainment and musical was given in the Washington Artillery Hall, by N. O. Chapter 72, U. D. C. and Camp Beauregard, sons of Veterans, but notwithstanding the fact that the use of the hall was donated the net result was only \$69.30.

August 7th, 1902, there was given a Tournament Festival in the Fair Grounds followed by a reception in Washington Artillery Hall, the evening of August 8th 1902, the net cash result of which was \$130.90.

The Army of Tennessee Camp No. 2, had in February, 1900, contributed \$125.00.

Appeals to the public continued and a few subscriptions were received from time to time as shown by the treasurer's reports.

In January, 1906, Col. J. B. Richardson, President. died, and Gen. J. A. Chalaron, 1st Vice- President, was elected President.

In May, 1907, the Louisiana Historical Society contributed \$50.00 to our fund.

In 1907 the present location was selected, and the City Park Association practically gave the ground, and contributed \$1,000.00 in money also.

On May 28th, 1908, this site was dedicated with appropriate ceremonies.

On December 15th, 1908, a contract had been entered into with Mr. Alex. Doyle, sculptor for the making of the bronze Equestrian statue for the sum of \$15,000.00, a low price, Mr. Doyle stated, because of his acquaintance with General Beauregard, and his wish to make a fine monument to him.

In July, 1909, Gen. J. A. Chalaron died, and on the 16th of August, 1909, Col. Alden McLellan was elected President of the Association.

On May 28th, 1912, the design model for the equestrian statue was accepted.

Contract was made with the Albert Weiblen Marble Co., of this city, for laying the foundation, and building the pedestal upon which the statue rests for \$5,900.00

On Nov. 14th, 1913, the corner stone was laid with appropriate ceremonies.

In the early years of the association, as soon as the executive committee had funds to invest they agreed to put our funds into premium bonds of the city of New Orleans. This measure I heartily advocated because of the premium drawing or lottery feature, and on account of the fact that our beloved General was criticized by some for honorably performing his duty for the La. State Lottery Company, in seeing that its drawings were honorably conducted.

This investment was a successful one. Whenever Premium Bonds were drawn and we had to cash them in, we reinvested in the same bonds.

Several small prizes were drawn and finally the prize premium of five thousand dollars was drawn by us. Thus about thirty per cent. of the cost of this beautiful equestrian statue came from our investment in Premium Bonds, through the medium of chance, and I take this as a beautiful protest against the want of patriotism on the part of the people of Louisiana in being so slow to honor the memory of the most-illustrious soldier our state produced in the great struggle between the states.

We are, however, glad to know that over three-fourths of the money came from the people who loved and honored his memory, and that finally we have this loving tribute to his dutiful life.

It is not to stand as an advocate of war, but to honor duty and true patriotism and worth, such as has distinguished Gen. G. T. Beauregard, whose memory we honor.

We trust that our executive committee in its final publication, shall be able to mention by name the people who have contributed the money and service in its building.
